- <u>Nurture persons</u> in Christian living through worship, the sacraments, spiritual disciplines, and other means of grace, such as Wesley's Christian conferencing;
- <u>Send persons</u> into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ by healing the sick, feeding the hungry, caring for the stranger, freeing the oppressed, being and becoming a compassionate, caring presence, and working to develop social structures that are consistent with the gospel; and

Discipleship Ministries bases its life and work on the scriptural mandates contained in the five following biblical texts:


- The Great Commandment Matthew 22:37-39 Love of God and neighbor underscores all of our activity.

"To equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." Ephesians 4:12

#### Ministry of the Laity

¶ 127. The Ministry of the Laity-The ministry of the laity flows from a commitment to Christ's outreaching love. Lay members of The United Methodist Church are, by history and calling, active advocates of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Every layperson is called to carry out the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20); every layperson is called to be missional. The witness of the laity, their Christ-like examples of everyday living as well as the sharing of their own faith experiences of the gospel, is the primary evangelistic ministry through which all people will come to know Christ and The United Methodist Church will fulfill its mission.

#### Ministry of the Elder / Local Pastor

¶ 340. Responsibilities and Duties of Elders and Licensed Pastors — ... Word, Sacrament, Order, and Service and thus serve in the local church and in extension ministries in witness and service of Christ's love and justice

#### Ministry of the Deacon

¶ 328. Responsibilities and Duties of Deacons
- The ministry of the deacon is a faithful
response of the mission of the Church
meeting the emerging needs of the future.
Deacons are accountable to the annual
conference and the bishop for the fulfillment
of their call to servant leadership. (2016 Book

## What is the why for leaders?

Making new places for new people: Equip core teams to identify creative leaders who have the capacity to launch new ministries, build discipleship practices, pray, and develop leadership processes that help empower new leaders as they are making disciples for Jesus Christ.

Development of principled Christian leaders: Equip core teams and church councils to identify creative leaders who have the capacity to pray, listen, launch/expand existing ministries, prepare communities for external missions, build discipleship practices, promote collaboration through community partnerships, and implement leadership practices that engage congregational leaders who are making disciples for Jesus Christ.
