A Brief History

The Professional Association of United Methodist Church Secretaries was organized on April 14, 1982, in Dallas, Texas. Since the beginning, meetings have been held annually, a quarterly newsletter published, by-laws and logo adopted, working committees appointed, chapters organized, and Certification Institute established.

Legislation was adopted at the 1988 General Conference stating the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) has the authority and responsibility: "To provide guidance and consultation for continuing education of church secretaries, including establishment of training and certification programs, and to provide assistance to the Professional Administrators of The United Methodist Connectional Structure." (United Methodist Book of Discipline, 2012, ¶807.19).

At the 2017 Annual Conference, and with the support of GCFA, the body approved a name change for the organization. The new name is "Professional Administrators of The United Methodist Connectional Structure" and should allow for a more inclusive membership.

How do I renew my membership?
